The intersection of a strong economy and health is the foundation of Reach Out's Inland Health Professions Coalition. The Inland Empire has the most severe doctor shortage in California, and critical shortages of nurses, specialists, behavioral health and public health professionals. IHPC is the leader in advancing policies and programs to achieve a health workforce that can meet the needs of an everexpanding and diverse Inland Empire. Last year alone, more than 7,500 employers, educators and students participated in IHPC's trainings, conferences, internships, and Nexus Groups. Reach Out is the Health Care Consultant to both Riverside and San Bernardino Counties' Workforce Development Boards.

CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES

Every year, more than 30,000 Inland Empire residents receive services and support from Reach Out. Homeless and foster youth are helped to continue their education and to find living-wage jobs; families that were caught in cycles of abuse are taught how to be nurturing and compassionate; and, students who are struggling in school due to bullying, trauma, and emotional pain are supported and deeply engaged to not only be able to overcome their grief, but to rise above and become leaders on their campuses and in their communities.

Reach Out specializes in creating thriving communities by supporting and mobilizing residents to take leadership positions to build the health and quality of life in the cities we serve. We are especially proud of our current work leading Partners for Innovative Communities, Latino Health Collaborative, Healthy San Bernardino and Healthy Jurupa Valley. CREATING SAFE COMMUNITIES THROUGH POLICY

With our core value of advocating for Health in All Policies, we have changed the policy landscape in our cities across the region. Cities are the go-to places for inspiration on creating safe and healthy environments for all our residents, and Reach Out's policy and advocacy work is profoundly influenced by our intersectoral partnerships with government, law enforcement, schools, residents, and businesses. In the past three years alone, Reach Out has passed 22 local ordinances that have created greater safety for our youth and families.



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Van Jones Keynote Speaker Day 1

Van Jones is the Founder of Dream Corps, a social entrepreneur, CNN political commentator and host of Redemption Project and The Van Jones Show on CNN. Famous for his heart-felt election night coverage, Jones showed up as "the voice of reason" for people in red states and blue throughout the volatile 2016 political season. In 2019, Van and his team at #cut50 succeeded in passing the FIRST STEP Act (a bipartisan Federal bill that the New York Times calls the most substantial breakthrough in criminal justice in a generation).

Jones has founded and led numerous social enterprises engaged in social and environmental justice. One of them being The Dream Corps, an organization that brings people together to solve America's toughest

problems. The Dream Corps' major initiatives are: #YesWeCode, aimed to help 100,000 young women and men from underrepresented backgrounds find success in the tech sector; #cut50, an initiative focused on making communities safer while reducing the number of people in our prisons and jails. And Green For All, which advances environmental solutions that prioritize families and workers living on the frontlines of some of the worst pollution in America. In response to much civil unrest and energy post-election, Jones launched the #Love Army -- a values based movement that is working for an America where everyone counts.

HEALING COMMUNITIES THROUGH EQUITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Robert K. Ross, M.D., is president and chief executive officer for The California Endowment (TCE). Dr. Ross has an extensive background in health philanthropy, as a public health administrator, and as a clinician.

During his tenure at TCE, the foundation has focused on the health needs of underserved Californians by championing the cause of health coverage for all children, reducing childhood obesity, strengthening the capacity of community health centers, improving health services for farm workers and ex? offender populations, and strengthening the pipeline for bringing racial and ethnic diversity to the health professions.


