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
## CONNECT UNITE TRANSFORM

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The Center for Civic Policy & Leadership engages existing and emerging leaders from throughout the Inland Empire Region to support building healthy, safe and peaceful communities. CCPL serves San Bernardino and Riverside Counties and the Eastern San Gabriel Valley region of Southern California (commonly referred to as “the Inland Valleys”). The target population consists of existing and emerging leaders serving our diverse communities of predominantly Latino and African American youth and families. While the project will target 10-20 leaders, the potential impact of policy implementation, compliance, and advocacy has the potential to affect thousands of residents of the Inland Valleys through increased development of critical mass of organizations and individuals aligned and working towards large-scale social change.

The Inland Health Professions Coalition (IHPC) was established in March 2007 to convene the health professions workforce stakeholders in the Riverside, San Bernardino and Pomona Valley. Members of the Inland Health Professions Coalition include K-12 partners, community college and university faculty, hospital and healthcare agency representatives, county office of education staff, and interested professional organizations and community agency representatives who work to address the growing need for healthcare workers in the Inland Region. Through collaboration with our partners, we strengthen the healthcare pipeline through work-based learning experiences for students and professional development opportunities for educators. As a result, we assist in forming a healthcare workforce that is diverse, culturally competent, and ready to serve the communities of the Inland Region.





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## Community Health Improvement Plans San Bernardino County & Riverside County

### CVS (Community Vital Signs)

CVS, Community Vital Signs was originally initiated by San Bernardino County Departments of Public and Behavioral Health as well as Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, CVS transformed into a community initiative to improve the health of all San Bernardino County residents.

In March 2012, a cross sector of community leaders and decision makers throughout the County gathered to discuss and adopt the Vision, Value, and Purpose statements developed by their peers. CVS envisions a county where a commitment to optimizing health and wellness is embedded in all decisions by residents, organizations and government.

#### Community Vital Signs is guided by the following values:

**Community-driven:** Shared leadership by and for residents, engaging and empowering all voices

**Cultural competency:** Respecting and valuing diverse communities and perspectives

**Inclusion:** Actively reaching out, engaging, and sharing power with diverse constituencies

**Equity:** Access to participation, resources and service, addressing historical inequities and disparities

**Integrity and Accountability:** Transparent and cost-effective use of resources

**Collaboration:** Shared ownership and responsibility

**Systemic change:** Transform structures, processes, and paradigms to promote sustained individual and community health and well-being

### SHAPE (Strategic Health Alliance Pursuing Equity)

SHAPE Riverside County Strategic Health Alliance Pursuing Equity is a community-wide effort to coordinate the resources of public health system partners to improve health for all communities in Riverside County. This initiative is coordinated by the Riverside County Health Coalition and its leadership team. The vision of SHAPE is to provide an equal opportunity for all Riverside County residents to achieve optimum and health and wellness.

#### SHAPE Riverside County is charged with doing the following to fulfill our vision of health in Riverside County:

**1) Community Health Assessment:** SHAPE supports and steers the process for conducting a comprehensive community health assessment for Riverside County.

**2) Community Health Improvement Plan:** SHAPE uses findings from the community health assessment to update a community health improvement plan, including priorities, goals, objectives, and strategies.

**3) Coordination and Collaboration:** SHAPE helps to coordinate and collaborates with community partners on community health planning and improvement activities in Riverside County.

**4) Capacity Building:** SHAPE acts as a resource for using data and best practices in community health planning and improvement activities.

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
